Palmer High School participated in Putnam County Athletics from 1923-1941. In the summer of 1941, the Palmer High School School District was terminated. A few weeks later a new school district was formed from basically the same area and it was called the Miller City-New Cleveland School District. This new district added the New Cleveland area to its base and gave some of its western properties to the Continental School District. This new school maintained an elementary at New Cleveland and one at Miller City through 2003. The high school was always at Miller City. In the fall of 2003, all the students were housed at the new school built in Miller City.
