# Vaughnsville Won Finals from Leipsic GOOD ATTENDANCE

After disposing of the snappy Columbus Grove team last week, the Vaughnsville boys had little trouble from opposition and coasted into the county championship the sixth time by defeating the Leipsic team in the final tournament game last Saturday evening. The score being 43 to 27.

Vaughnsville led their opponents throughout the entire contest. They were first to score when Lewis picked off a couple from the foul line. White followed with two free throws and both registered. Sakemiller then added three points, a goal and a free throw and White duplicated the trick. Collar of Vaughnsville added another field goal and a foul before Place added a field goal for Leipsic. Collar and Lewis each caged a fielder to make the count 12 to 7 at the quarter with the champions in the lead.

The second quarter started off with a bang when Sakemiller threw one from the field. White eluded his guard and slipped through two points and Blauvelt was awarded a free throw. Schey missed a foul but Collar made his free throw good. Place and Moenter each looped through fielders as did White, but Lewis and Sakemiller kept their team out in front at the half 18 to 17 with a foul and a field goal.

The second half was really a slaughter for the local boys. Clymer was the only man to score while every Vaughnsville player rung up at least one counter with Sakemiller, Heidlebaugh and Collar getting four each. The third period saw the Vaughnsville boys pulling away and the count was 34 to 19.

In a desperate attempt to overtake the leaders, the Leipsic boys probably played the best basketball in the last quarter of the final game. Though probably weakened by substitutions, they battled to the finish and allowed the Vaughnsville boys to make but one field goal while they themselves were accumulating four and a couple of fouls for good measure.

In this final quarter, White again proved to be the high point man with five to his credit, Clymer got three and Wagner broke into the game with a nice field goal.
