Mayberry's 22 Assists and Bucket Gives Bulldogs a Win Over Lincolnview – New PCL Record

Ty Mayberry scored a bucket with only seconds left in the game to give the Columbus Grove Bulldogs а 90-89 win over Lincolnview. In addition to his scoring eight points for the game, Mayberry had 22 assists which was one more than his previous high of 21 assists which he had against Delphos Jefferson. He increased his assist total to 191 which nearly doubles the previous assist record at Columbus Grove High School during his senior year.

Mike Snoke scored ten points to lead the first quarter scoring for the Bulldogs and received help from Tom Bowers who scored five points. They were followed by Bowers and Snoke with four points and Mike Wyant and Mark Jones with two points each.

In the third period the Lancers outscored the Bulldogs 22-20 to cut the Grove lead to 66-63 at the end of the third eight minutes. Snoke scored ten points, Mayberry scored four and Fuerst and Wyant added two points each in the third stanza for the Bulldogs.

In the final quarter the Lancers outscored Grove 26-24 but fell one point short at the end of the game. The Bulldogs fourth quarter scoring was paced by Fritz Fuerst and Mike Snoke with eight points each and Wyant, Jones Bowers and Mayberry with two points each.

Snoke led the overall scoring for the Bulldogs with 32 points and was followed by Fuerst with 22, Bowers with 13, Wyant and Mayberry with eight and Jones with seven. Lincolnview was paces by Terry Owens with 26 points, Mike Collins with 20, Brett Thatcher with 12, Brent Unterbrink with 11, Mark Smith with 10, Tim Shank with six and Stan Weldy and Mark Keith with two points each.

There were a total of 48 fouls shots taken in the ballgame. The Bulldogs hit 16 of 25 for 64% and the Lancers hit 15 of 23 for 65%. Grove hit 37 of 73 shots from the floor for 51% and their opponents hit 37 of 84 for 44%.

Bowers, Fuerst and Snoke pulled down seven rebounds each for the Bulldogs, Mark Jones had six, Mike Wyant had five and Ty Mayberry helped out with four. Mark Fuerst also helped the Bulldog cause with six steals.

Grove took 36 rebounds to Lincolnview's 30.

Bulldog head coach Jim Kolts noted that both Bowers and Fuerst got into early foul trouble and had to set out for a quarter in the first half of the ballgame. Kolts also commented on Gary Selhorst who may miss the rest of the season with hand and leg injuries.

The Bulldogs will face tough action this weekend as they travel to Crestview and host Pandora-Gilboa. Grove lost to both teams last season and will seek to avenge their losses and finish with a 13-5 record.
