State Ration Board Rules Against Use of Buses

With the state ration board finally giving an official “no” to the use of school buses for any extra curricular activities, Putnam County school authorities are discussing what to do with the athletic, music and scholastic gatherings in the county this week.

The biggest problem is what to do with basketball which is the biggest attraction to the athletic-minded people in this county. The issue will be settled at a meeting of coaches and school officials at Vaughnsville next Tuesday night.

Parents and fans have offered the use of their cars to haul teams so far. With rationing coming on it is pointed out that at a minimum of 90 miles a month is given to car owners for family use. More amounts of fuel are given for business and official purposes. Fans desirous of having at least a limited schedule point out that two games a month with teams not too far distant would not really hinder their family driving. It’s all a matter of emphasis, some say.

So far, the Pandora school has held the question open with no decision made for the basketball schedule and team. It is possible that P.H.S. will have a team if it is proved that attendance and transportation means warrant the organization.
