

# Grove Girls Take Championship

**Tournament Decided by Six Hot Games**

**Winner Will be Declared the County Champs for the First Time**

After a series of more one-sided struggles, the Columbus Grove girls clearly demonstrated their right to be called girls' champions.

Continental girls were fortunate at drawing a bye in the first round coming thru to the finals with only one victory to their credit, that one a two-point lead over Leipsic, 7 to 5.

Girls from the Grove had easy sailing in the final game tuning up a large score and a bigger margin than they had merited in the semi-finals against Ottawa or in the preliminary round against Vaughnsville.

The score of the final girls' game was 24 to 6 with Continental in the low end.

The series drew the largest crowds in Armory history. Every available bit of floor space was taken and hundreds stood during each session. Scores were refused admission to the final games because of lack of room to accommodate them.

Credit is due the tournament management and officials of the games for the spirit of friendliness, fairness and clean play that permeated the series.
