We have a completely new set of champions in basketball in Putnam County, proud heroic athletes who have carried off the palm of victory and are wearing the laurels that the glory of the fifth annual county tournament has bestowed on the winners.

Crawfis Girls Win

The champion girl team is Crawfis. Fans all over the township are wild with enthusiasm and are heaping honors on their heroines in songs of celebration and throwing feasts and banquets galore for the prize youth of their community.

All the more credit is due this this team, it is claimed, because they fought their way to the top against the strongest opposition that could be mustered, battling steadily toward the goal of ultimate victory and triumph.

They met perhaps their toughest opposition in the first tilt, when they connected with the Ottawa girls, and won out by a single point in an overtime period. A lone foul told the story and the score was changed from a tie at 19 all to twenty for Crawfis and nineteen for Ottawa. No other scoring was done in the overtime period.

The will to win was strong in the mental attitude of the Crawfis players. Determination was an asset to them and they had just enough to set them going right and holding their attention to the object in mind by winning the tournament.

They were not bothered by a feeling of overconfidence and they were properly steeled to the task before them. No matter what any one might say about the relative strength of the teams entered, the Crawfis girl team stood the test of battle and are hailed as county champions.
