Blanchard Lassies Were Never in Danger

The 1929-1930 high school basketball season in Putnam County came to a close last Friday and Saturday with the annual tournament at the Armory in Ottawa which brought forth Crawfis College as the undisputed champions. They triumphed after a grueling test in the two-day performances.

With eight teams entered, the Crawfis champions were called upon to play three games to win the title and the cup that goes with it as an award. Vaughnsville was taken to camp by the count of 36 to 12. Leipsic was downed by the score of 38 to 14 and finally Columbus Grove in the finals was handed the short end of a count of 33 to 17.

In the semi-finals, Columbus Grove disposed of Palmer by a score of 23 to 15, Allen leading for the winners in scoring with 16 points. Core added five and Ruggley two for the total of 23.

Yarnell for Palmer made nine points, assisted by S. Babek with four and A. Babek with two.

The Crawfis team then went into action against Leipsic and rolled up 38 points to 14 on the other side of the

ledger. Compton for Crawfis scored 16 points, Miller Contributed 14 and Hickey the remaining eight.

For Leipsic, Standley scored six, Andrews four and Bennett the other four.

In the championship game, Columbus Grove was forced to bow to the superior Crawfis aggregation. The score was 33 to 17. Compton of Crawfis again shone with 16 points, Hickey connected for nine and Miller for eight.

Allen of the Grove led on her side with 11 points, Ruggley added four and Core the remaining two.

Slocum and Lehman of Toledo refereed all the games in a satisfactory manner. While the crowds were not quite as large as in previous years, interest lagged at no time and rivalry at times reached a peak of intensity and fervor. Supt. H. J. Benning of Glandorf was the official scorer and John Klein of Ottawa the official time keeper.
