

Wenzlick Earns All-State Honors Sets Season and Career PCL Records

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Ottoville's Karla Wenzlick doesn't necessarily look for attention, but her basketball skills draw her plenty of attention.

Her basketball skills earned her one final big award last week as she was named Ohio's Co-Player of the Year in Division IV. The Big Green's standout player shared the award with Zanesville's Rosecrans Kwame Clark. Both players also earned Division IV first team honors.

The three-time Putnam County League Player of the Year averaged 24.0 points a game this season as she set an Ottoville and county career scoring record with 1,851 points. She also scored 611 points this season, a new county girl's record for a single season. She also shot a combined 52 percent from the floor as she hit

55 percent from two-point range and 44 percent from three-point range. She hit 84 percent from the line, grabbed 8.1 rebounds a game, dished out 138 assists and grabbed 118 steals. Her Big Green teams advanced to the regional all four of her years and advanced to the state tournament twice, including this season.

Wenzlick, a 5-8 senior guard, will take her basketball skills to the college level at Northern Kentucky University. This was the second straight season the Ottoville product was a first team all-Ohio selection.

Karla's point total was incorrectly reported to be 611 in 1996. The correct season total was 583 points.
