The PCL from 1924-1940 was very inconsistent. From year to year, newspaper articles would mention that a league was going to be formed. Some schools would even declare themselves the "champions of Putnam County". However, the first documented and recognized PCL games were not played until the 1934-1935 season with Leipsic winning with a 7-0 record. Leipsic and Pandora tied for the PCL championship the following year in 1936. From 1937-1940 the Putnam County schools had a plan to play each other, but there was no official PCL champion declared. Girl's basketball was entirely dropped in 1941. In the early 1960's, an organization called the Girl's Athletic Association and later the Girl's Interscholastic Association (GAA or GIA) was formed. The OHSAA restarted girl's basketball as we know it today during the 1975-1976 school year.
