Columbus Grove's first reported high school girl's basketball team was in 1914 when the Bulldogs defeated an unknown opponent 10-4. The coach was F. W. Sexton. In 1924, the Ohio High School Athletic Association was formed and took control of high school basketball, but would not allow the girls to participate in tournament play beyond the Putnam County Tournament. Girls basketball was ended following the 1940 season. From 1965-1975, the girls played under the direction of two organizations, the GAA (Girls Athletic Association) or the GIA (Girls Interscholastic Association). Girls' basketball was not sanctioned by the OHSAA until the 1975-1976 school year. Many of the scores previous to 1976 are missing. Thus, the actual wins for Columbus Grove is definitely much higher.
