Leipsic's first reported high school girl's basketball team was in 1917 when the Vikings defeated Grand Rapids, 2-0. The coach was unknown. In 1924, the Ohio High School Athletic Association was formed and took control of high school basketball, but would not allow the girls to participate in tournament play beyond the Putnam County Tournament. Girls basketball was ended following the 1940 season. From 1971-1975, the girls played under the direction of two organizations, the GAA (Girls Athletic Association) or the GIA (Girls Interscholastic Association). Girls' basketball was not sanctioned by the OHSAA until the 1975-1976 school year. Many of the scores previous to 1976 are missing. Thus, the actual wins for Leipsic is definitely much higher.

Palmer's first reported high school girl's basketball team was in 1925 when the Wildcats defeated Ottawa Public, 11-4. The coach was Superintendent Joseph Windle. In 1924, the Ohio High School Athletic Association was formed and took control of high school basketball, but would not allow the girls to participate in tournament play beyond the Putnam County Tournament. Girls basketball was ended following the 1940 season. Palmer High School's charter was lost in the summer of 1941 and then, almost immediately, the Miller City-New Cleveland School District was formed in the fall of 1941. From 1971-1975, the girls played under the direction of two organizations, the GAA (Girls Athletic Association) or the GIA (Girls Interscholastic Association). Girls' basketball was not sanctioned by the OHSAA until the 1975-1976 school year. Many of the scores previous to 1976 are missing. Thus, the actual wins for Palmer/Miller City is definitely much higher.
