We were told that the object is to put the ball in that basket, and when they did put it

in the basket the durn ball wouldn't stay because there was a hole in the bottom, yet it counted so many points – and how that crowd would yell.

We heard some one say, "That player there has 'shot' four or five baskets." We wondered how he could shoot four or five baskets when there were but two in the Armory and not a gun of any kind.

Now and then we would hear the word "foul," that would bring to our mind the base ball bat, but in this game they have no use for bats – except a "bat" in the eye occasionally.
