

Ottoville Beats Bluffton for Coach Klemans 200th Win

Coach Kleman claimed his 200th win as the head coach of Ottoville when the Big Green defeated the Bluffton Pirates.

Ottoville turned up the offense and defense in the fourth quarter of their game with Bluffton Saturday afternoon.

The Big Green doubled up the Pirates as they rallied for a 41-35 non-league girls' basketball win.

Ottoville trailed 27-25 entering the final eight minutes of action but then turned up the offense to score 16 points while becoming stingy on defense as they allowed only eight points.

Erica Vorst scored all eight of her points in the final quarter which included a 6-of-8 performance at the free throw line. Jen Burgei and Stacey Wannemacher both added four points in the final quarter to the Big Green's rally.

Wannemacher led the Big Green with a game high 16 points and she had seven rebounds and four steals. Amy Honigford added nine points.

Megan Kleman also had seven rebounds and dished out four assists, while Burgei had three assists and four steals.

Mitterholtzer led the Pirates with 14 points and Varger had nine points.
