#### Carol Lammers – Lafountain 1974 – 1977 1,321 Points

#### First Miller City Player to Score 1,000 Points

Carol started her varsity basketball career at Mill City in 1974 under the guide lines of the Girls Interscholastic Association. This organization was the frontrunner of the Ohio High School Athletic Association.

In 1974, she scored 151 points in seven games. Miller City's record was 5-2. There were no tournaments yet.

In 1975, Carol scored 171 points in seven games. The Wildcats, 7-0, won a PCL Title. There still were no tournaments for the girls at this time.

In 1976, she scored 497 points with 146 rebounds. Miller City, 14-2, won a PCL, Sectional and District Championship, but lost to Tinora in the Regionals, 58-55. This was the first year that the OHSAA ran the girl's high school programs.

In 1977, Carol scored 502 points with 201 rebounds, 54 steals and 22 assists. She was named 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-PCL. Miller City finished the season with a 10-5 record.

For her career, Carol scored 1,321 points with over 400 rebounds in just 45 games! During her tenure, MC was 36-9.

After graduation, Carol attended Dayton University. For her career, she scored 2,151 points with 1,096 rebounds and 177 steals. The Flyers were 121-18 during her tenure, winning the National Tournament in 1980 and placing 2<sup>nd</sup> in 1979.

In 1981, Carol was UD's MVP, an Academic All-American and a Kodak Small College All-American.

She was inducted into Dayton's Hall of Fame in 1989 and the Atlantic 10 Conference Legends Class in 2017.

#### Pam Inkrott – Schroeder 1978 – 1981 878 Points

Pam started her varsity basketball career at Miller City in 1978 when she scored 53 points with 61 rebounds and 25 steals.

In 1979, Pam scored 217 points with 121 rebounds and 33 steals. She was named 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-PCL and Honorable Mention Northwestern Ohio.

In 1980, she scored 267 points with 141 rebounds and 16 steals. Pam was named 1st Team All-PCL.

Miller City, 14-8, won a Sectional Championship, but lost to Delphos Jefferson in the Districts 68-49.

In 1981, Pam had her best season when she scored 341 points with 164 rebounds and 57 steals. She was named 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-PCL and 2<sup>nd</sup> Team District 8.

The Wildcats, 20-3, won a Sectional Championship, but lost in the Districts to Delphos St. Johns, 66-50.

For her career, she scored 878 points with 487 rebounds and 131 steals. During her tenure, Miller City was 43-32.

#### Jane Schroeder – Lammers 1984 – 1987 648 Points

Jane started her varsity basketball career at Miller City in 1984 when she scored 4 points.

In 1985, Jane scored 123 points with 34 rebounds, 56 steals, 49 assists and 6 blocked shots.

In 1986, she scored 318 points with 130 rebounds, 100 steals, 100 assists and 1 blocked shot. Jane was named 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-PCL, PCL Player of the Year and 1<sup>st</sup> Team District 8.

In 1987, Jane scored 203 points with 94 rebounds, 60 steals, 52 assists and 16 blocked shots. She was named 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-PCL and 1<sup>st</sup> Team District 8.

Miller City, 18-4, won a PCL Title.

For her career, Jane scored 648 points with 282 rebounds, 216 steals, 201 assists and 23 blocked shots. During her final three years, the Wildcats were 42-21.

### Amy Vennekotter – Marcus 1985 – 1988 1,147 Points

Amy Vennekotter started her varsity basketball career at Miller City in 1985 when she scored 94 points with 95 rebounds, 28 steals and 12 assists.

In 1986, Amy scored 288 points with 193 rebounds, 48 steals and 32 assists. She was named 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-PCL and Honorable Mention Northwestern Ohio.

The Wildcats improved their record to 17-5.

In 1987, Amy scored 300 points with 214 rebounds, 49 steals and 45 assists. She was named 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-PCL, 2<sup>nd</sup> Team District 8 and Honorable Mention Northwestern Ohio.

Miller City, 18-4, won a PCL Championship.

In 1988, Amy had her best season when she scored 465 points, 205 rebounds, 41 steals and 75 assists. She was named 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-PCL, PCL Player of the Year, 1<sup>st</sup> Team District 8, 1<sup>st</sup> Team Northwestern Ohio and 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-Ohio.

The Wildcats, 17-6, won a Sectional Championship, but lost to Kalida in the Districts 59-56.

For her career, Amy scored 1,147 points with 707 rebounds, 166 steals and 164 assists. During her tenure, Miller City was 59-27.

#### Beth Lammers – Ruhe 1986 – 1989 — 985 Points

Beth started her varsity basketball career at Miller City in 1986 when she scored 10 points with 18 rebounds, 6 steals and 3 assists.

In 1987, Beth scored 181 points with 131 rebounds, 46 steals and 34 assists.

Miller City, 18-4, won a PCL Championship.

In 1988, Beth scored 377 points with 141 rebounds, 73 steals and 50 assists. She was named 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-PCL, 2<sup>nd</sup> Team District 8 and Special Mention Northwestern Ohio.

The Wildcats, 17-6, won a Sectional Championship, but lost to Kalida in the Districts 59-56.

In 1989, Beth scored 417 points with 116 rebounds, 66 steals and 55 assists. She was named 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-PCL, 1<sup>st</sup> Team District 8, 2<sup>nd</sup> Team Northwestern Ohio and 3<sup>rd</sup> Team All-Ohio.

For her career, Beth scored 985 points with 406 rebounds, 191 steals and 142 assists. During her tenure, the Wildcats were 66-22.

#### Brooke Hermiller - Callahan 2001 – 2004 726 Points

Brooke started her varsity basketball career at Miller City in 2001 when she scored 92 points with 89 rebounds, 8 steals and 8 assists.

In 2002, Brooke scored 138 points with 136 rebounds, 19 steals and 20 assists.

The Wildcats, 14-8, won a PCL and Sectional Championship, but lost to Ottoville in the District Semi-Finals 59-51.

In 2003, Brooke scored 226 points with 144 rebounds, 38 steals and 39 assists. She was named 2<sup>nd</sup> Team All-PCL.

Miller City, 21-4, won a PCL, Sectional and District Championship, but lost in the Regional Finals to Holgate 38-37.

In 2004, Brooke had her best season when she scored 270 points with 126 rebounds, 30 steals and 42 assists. She was named 1st Team All-PCL, PCL Player of the Year, 1st Team District 8, 1st Team Northwestern Ohio and 2nd Team All-Ohio

Miller City, 25-1, won a PCL, Sectional, District and Regional Championship, but lost in the State Semi-Finals to Mansfield St. Peter 54-45.

For her career, Brooke scored 726 points with 495 rebounds, 95 steals and 109 assists. During her tenure, Miller City was 66-28.

#### Megan Niese 2002 – 2004 657 Points
