The boys' 220 yard dash has been held in every PCL Track and Field Meet since 1920. The first dash and record was held by Ridenour of Continental when he ran the event in 30.6 seconds. In 1963, Gene Shawber of Leipsic, set the standard at 22.5 seconds which held up for 46 years. The current record of 21.8 seconds is held by Sam Spallinger of Pandora-Gilboa and was set in 2010. The event was converted to a comparable length of 200 meters in 1980.
