From 1920-1927 the boys and girls participated in the same PCL Track and Field Meet. The boys usually had 12-14 events and the girls 2-4. The scores were added together for only ONE PCL CHAMPION. In 1928, even though the girls still only had four events, a boy's and a girl's PCL champion was determined.

There are discrepancies in the early years of the Putnam County Track and Field Meet as to when it officially started. An article in the Leipsic Free Press states that a Field Meet was held in 1914 and that a second one was going to be held in the spring of 1915. However, there is no mention in any of the county newspapers of any Field Meet in 1914 or the results for the 1915 Track and Field Meet. There is no mention of any meets from 1916-1919. Bad weather and World War I may have been the reason for the cancellations. Thus, the first Putnam County Track and Field Meet can be documented by newspaper reports beginning in 1920 with events, winners, participants and times.
