A New Game Basket Ball Had a 3 Point Goal Back In 1895 Delphos Herald - 1895

Basket ball is a game that is the rage now. The end aim of the game is to toss a ball, which is the size of a small football, into one of the two larger baskets suspended at either end of the field. The winning side is the one which lands the ball in the opponent's basket. The basket is placed about ten feet high. When the game is played in a gymnasium, the basket is bracketed to the side of the wall. No pushing, tripping, shouldering, is allowed. The score is counted by points. A majority of points decides the game. A goal counts 3 points, a foul one point.

Four girls from St. John's drove by horse and buggy from St. John's to Ottoville to see a basketball game. We returned the next day, full of excitement and enthusiasm. We talked to our classmates, teachers and then to our Pastor Reverend Father Rupert for permission. At first it was an emphatic NO!!!! Later he agreed providing we did all the work. Ricker's Lumber Yard furnished the lumber and helped build the backboards. High school students melted paraffin and spread it on the auditorium floor. We then wrapped rags around our shoes and skated around to polish it. This was Delphos St. John's first basketball court. Does anyone remember?
