The Leipsic Vikings were the first of many boys' basketball teams from PC to participate in the State tournament.

In 1927 Ottoville placed 1st in the PCT by defeating Columbus Grove 35-23. The Big Green qualified for State by winning four games at the Sectional and District level of tournament play. Since there was no Regional level of play, 16 teams qualified for State. Ottoville lost the first game at State to Lockland 40-14. Cyril Becker, 1st Team All-PCLT, Carl Leis, 2nd Team All-PCLT and Harold Wannemacher, 2nd Team All-PCLT led Ottoville, coached by the legendary Louis W. Heckman, to a 19-5 record. This was the 2nd team to qualify for State without Regional tournament.

1950 - Miller City - State Champs

In 1950 Miller City placed 1st in the Putnam County Tournament by defeating Continental 43-32. The Wildcats qualified for State by winning five games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Miller City won the State Tournament by defeating Corning 52-45 and Eaton 44-36. Skip Meyer, 1st Team All-PCLT and Frank Schroeder, 1st Team All-PCLT led Miller City, coached by Norris Simpson, to an undefeated 29-0 record. This was the 3rd team to qualify for State and the first State Champion.

1952 – Miller City – Poll Champs

In 1952 Miller City finished the regular season with an 18-1 record and claimed the 1st Boys' Associated Press State Poll Championship. The Wildcats lost in the District Finals to Columbus Grove 26-25. This was the third meeting for these two powerhouses from Putnam County. Miller City won the first two games 44-42 and 32-30. Miller City finished the season at 25-2 and Columbus Grove at 22-4, losing to Minster in the Regional Semi-Finals. The Wildcats were led by Jerry Kuhlman, Roy Meyer and Junior McDonald. They were coached by Norris Simpson. Meyer and McDonald were also major players on the 1950 State Championship team.

1967 - Kalida - State Qualifier

In 1967 Kalida tied for 3rd in the PCL with a 5-3 record. The Wildcats qualified for State by winning seven games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Kalida lost the first game at State to Arcanum 55-48. Bill Trenkamp, 2nd Team All-PCL, led Kalida, coached by Allan Clase, to a 17-9 record. This was the 4th team to qualify for State and the Wildcats 1st trip.

1972 - Continental - State Qualifier

In 1972 Continental tied for 3rd in the PCL with a 4-3 record. The Pirates qualified for State by winning six games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Continental lost the first game at State to Ridgedale 73-68. Greg Spitnale, 1st Team All-PCL and Don Brown, 2nd Team All-PCL led Continental, coached by Don Huber, to a 19-6 record. This was the 5th team to qualify for State and the Pirates first trip.

1977 - Continental - State Qualifier

Kalida won the State Tournament by defeating South Eastern 73-56 and C.A.P.E 58-44. Dan Utendorf, 1st Team All-PCL, Greg Verhoff, 1st All-PCL and Rob Kortokrax, 2nd Team All-PCL led Kalida, coached by Dick Kortokrax, to a 27-1 record. This was the 11th team to qualify for State and was the Wildcats 3rd trip. This was Kalida's 1st State Championship.

Ottawa-Glandorf was the 2nd boys' team from Putnam County to win a Poll Championship. The Titans lost in the District Finals to Coldwater, 66-51. The Titans were led by Eric Morman, 1st Team All-Ohio, 1st Team and WBL Player of the Year and Brent Kaufman, 1st Team WBL. Dave Sweet, WBL Coach of the Year, led Ottawa-Glandorf to a 22-1 record.

1988 - Kalida - State Runner-Up

In 1988 Ottawa-Glandorf placed 1st in the PCL with a 7-0 record. The Wildcats qualified for State by winning five games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Kalida won the first game at State by defeating Fort Loramie 63-54. The Wildcats lost the State Championship game to Columbus Wehrle 71-54. Brian Vorst, 1st Team All-PCL, Player of the Year and Dave Hovest, 1st Team All-PCL, led Kalida, coached by Dick

Kortokrax, PCL Coach of the Year, to a 25-2 record. This was the $12^{\rm th}$ team to qualify for State and the Wildcat's $4^{\rm th}$ trip.
