Fort Jennings' first reported high school girl's basketball team was in 1970. The coach was Allyn Barnes. From 1970-1975, the girls played under the direction of two organizations, the GAA (Girls Athletic Association) or the GIA (Girls Interscholastic Association). Girls' basketball was not sanctioned by the OHSA until the 1975-1976 school year. Many of the scores previous to 1976 are missing. Thus, the actual wins for Fort Jennings is higher.

Kalida's first reported high school girl's basketball team was in 1915. The coach was unknown. In 1924, the Ohio High School Athletic Association was formed and took control of high school basketball, but would not allow the girls to participate in tournament play beyond the Putnam County Tournament. Girls basketball was ended following the 1940 season. From 1972-1975, the girls played under the direction of two organizations, the GAA (Girls Athletic Association) or the GIA (Girls Interscholastic Association). Girls' basketball was not sanctioned by the OHSA until the 1975-1976 school year. Many of the scores previous to 1976 are missing. Thus, the actual wins for Kalida is definitely much higher.
