# Legends of Pandora-Gilboa 

## Roxie Zimmerly - Schumacher 1984-1987 1,458 Points

First P-G Player to Score 1,000 Points PANDORA-GILBOA'S \#1 SCORER

Roxie started off her high school basketball career at Pandora-Gilboa in 1984 by scoring 206 points.

In 1985, she exploded by scoring 454 points. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District 8 and Special Mention Northwestern Ohio.

The Rockets finished at 13-8 which was the best record that Pandora-Gilboa had ever had.

In 1986, Roxie scored another 412 points as she received even more honors. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, BVC Player of the Year, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District 8, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio and Special Mention AllOhio.

Pandora-Gilboa's record improved to 18-4 as they claimed their first BVC Championship.

In 1987, Roxie scored 426 points. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team PCL, PCL Player of the Year, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District 8, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio and $3^{\text {rd }}$ Team AllOho.

Pandora-Gilboa finished at 21-2, winning their first PCL, $2^{\text {nd }}$ BVC and $1^{\text {st }}$ Sectional Championship. The Rockets lost to Delphos St. Johns in the District Finals 65-53.

For her career, Roxie scored 1,498 points. During her tenure, the Rockets were 57-30.

## Mary Jo Gerten - Eiden 1984-1987 1,052 Points

Mary Jo began her varsity career at Pandora-Gilboa in 1984 when she scored 1,052 .

In 1984, Mary Jo scored 193 points.
In 1985, she scored 269 points. Mary Jo was named $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-PCL and $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-BVC.

The Rockets finished at 13-8 which was the best record that Pandora-Gilboa had ever had.

In 1986, Mary Jo scored 255 points. She was named $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-PCL and $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC.

Pandora-Gilboa's record improved to 18-4 as they claimed their first BVC Championship.

In 1987, she scored 335 points. Mary Jo was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC and $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team District 8.

Pandora-Gilboa finished at 21-2, winning their first PCL, second BVC and first Sectional Championship. The Rockets lost to Delphos St. Johns in the District Finals 65-53.

For her career, Mary Jo scored 1,052 points. During her tenure, the Rockets were 57-30.

## Stacy Hermiller - Alt <br> 1989-1992 1,262 Points

Stacy Hermiller began her varsity basketball career at Pandora-Gilboa High School as a freshman in 1989 by scoring 109 points.

In 1990, Stacy scored 328 points with 169 rebounds, 62 steals and 55 assists. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team District 8 and Honorable Mention Northwestern Ohio.

In 1991, Stacy scored 355 points with 175 rebounds, 12 steals and 10 assists. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District 8 and Honorable Mention Northwestern Ohio.

In 1992, Stacy scored 470 points with 201 rebounds, 38 steals and 47 assists. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, PCL Player of the Year, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District 8 and Player of the Year and $1^{\text {st }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio.

For her career, Stacy scored 1,262 points with 564 rebounds, 112 steals and 112 assists. During her tenure, P-G was 4637.

## Amy Amstutz - Zuercher 1994-1997 1,202 Points

Amy started her varsity basketball career at Pandora-Gilboa in 1994 when she scored 45 points

In 1995, Amy scored 256 points with 134 rebounds. She was named $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-BVC.

In 1996, Amy scored 494 points with 226 rebounds, 51 steals and 21 assists. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District 8 and $3^{\text {rd }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio.

The Rockets, 16-5, won the BVC Championship.
In 1997, Amy had her best season when she scored 494 points with 226 rebounds, 51 steals and 21 assists. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, BVC Player of the Year, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District $8,1^{\text {st }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio and Special Mention All-Ohio.

Amy was also selected to play in the Ohio/Indiana All-Star Game.

For her career, Amy scored 1,202 points with 538 rebounds, 100 steals and 75 assists.

Amy played college basketball at Owens Community College. In 1999, she was the OCCAC Player of the Year.

Kari Warren started her high school basketball career at Pandora-Gilboa in 1998 when she scored 171 points with 47 rebounds.

Pandora-Gilboa, 11-11, won a Sectional Championship, but lost to Kalida in the Districts, 72-54.

In 1999, Kari scored 282 points with 180 rebounds, 18 steals, 45 assists and 70 blocked shots. She was named $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team District 8 and Honorable Mention Northwestern Ohio.

The Rockets, 16-6, won its second consecutive Sectional Championship, but lost to Lincolnview in the Districts, 5848.

In 2000, Kari scored 317 points with 214 rebounds, 56 steals, 50 assists and 96 blocked shots. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District 8 and $3^{\text {rd }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio.

Pandora-Gilboa, 19-4, won a PCL and a Sectional Championship, but lost to Delphos St. Johns in the District Finals, 47-39.

In 2001, Kari had her best season when she scored 375 points with 198 rebounds, 28 steals, 21 assists and 73 blocked shots. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team

All-BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District 8 and Honorable Mention Northwestern Ohio.

The Rockets, 18-4, won its $4^{\text {th }}$ consecutive Sectional Championship, but lost in the Districts to Crestview, 39-36.

For her career, Kari scored 1,145 points with 639 rebounds, 239 blocked shots and over 100 steals and assists respectively. Pandora-Gilboa's record was 64-25 during her tenure.

Kari played college basketball at Findlay.

## Courtney Schmersal 2004-2007 1,068 Points

Courtney began her varsity basketball career at PandoraGilboa in 2004 when she scored 10 points.

In 2005, she scored 270 points with 59 rebounds, 35 assists and 49 steals. She was name $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC and $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team District 8.

In 2006, Courtney scored 392 points with 76 rebounds, 37 assists and 49 steals. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District 8, $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio and Honorable Mention All-Ohio.

In 2007, she had her best season when she scored 396 points with 64 rebounds, 38 steals and 30 assists. Courtney was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, BVC Player of the Year, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District $8,2^{\text {nd }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio and Special Mention All-Ohio

The Rockets, 13-9, won a Sectional Championship, but lost to Hopewell Loudon in the Districts 36-31.

For her career, Courtney scored 1,068 points with 199 rebounds, 110 steals and 128 assists.

Courtney attended and played basketball at Defiance College.

## Stephanie Recker <br> 2008-2011 1,235 Points

Stephanie Recker began her varsity career at Pandora-Gilboa in 2008 as a freshman by scoring 197 points with 123 rebounds, 40 steals and 37 assists.

Pandora-Gilboa, 16-6, won a Sectional Championship, but lost in the Districts to Fostoria St. Wendelin, 44-33.

In 2009, Stephanie scored 286 points with 81 rebounds, 31 steals and 56 assists. She was named $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-PCL, $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-BVC and $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team District 8 .

P-G had another fine season finishing with a 17-6 record and a Sectional Championship, but lost to Carey in the Districts, 50-45.

In 2010, Stephanie scored 325 points with 91 rebounds, 54 steals and 79 assists. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, PCL Player of the Year, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District $8,1^{\text {st }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio and $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-Ohio.

The Rockets, 21-3, won a Sectional and District Championship, but lost in the Regionals to Minster, 46-35.

In 2011, Stephanie scored 427 points with 141 rebounds, 54 steals and 84 assists. She was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL. PCL Player of the Year, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District $8,1^{\text {st }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio and $3{ }^{\text {rd }}$ Team All-Ohio.

Stephanie also played in two prestigious All-Star games the North/South All-Ohio All-Star Game and the Ohio/Indiana All-Star Game.

Pandora-Gilboa, 16-6, won its fourth consecutive Sectional Championship, but lost in the Districts to Arlington, 51-18.

For her career, Stephanie scored 1,235 points with 436 rebounds, 179 steals and 256 assists. During her tenure, P-G was 70-21.

Following graduation, Stephanie played basketball at Toledo University for four years, 2012-2015.

## Megan Maag 2011-2014 1,029 Points

Megan started her varsity basketball career at PandoraGilboa in 2011 when she scored 4 points.

In 2012, she scored 252 points with 172 rebounds, 23 steals and 39 assists. Megan was named $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-PCL, $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-BVC and Honorable Mention Northwestern Ohio.

In 2013, Megan scored 327 points with 138 rebounds, 43 steals and 40 assists. She was named $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-PCL, $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-BVC, $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team District 8 and Special Mention Northwestern Ohio.

In 2014, she had her best season when she scored 446 points with 188 rebounds, 41 steals and 48 assists. Megan was
named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District 8 and Honorable Mention Northwestern Ohio.

Pandora-Gilboa, 16-9, won a Sectional Championship, but lost to Crestview in the Districts, 56-42.

For her career, Megan scored 1,029 points with 498 rebounds, 107 steals and 127 assists. During her tenure, the Rockets were 44-26.

## Lacie Fenstermaker 2019-2022 1,179 Points

Lacie began her high school career at Pandora-Gilboa in 2019 by scoring 194 points with 170 rebounds, 52 steals and 31 assists.

In 2020, she scored 262 points with 242 rebounds, 31 steals and 38 assists.

In 2021, Lacie scored 288 points with 300 rebounds, 52 steals and 43 assists. She was named $2^{\text {nd }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC and $3^{\text {rd }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio.

In 2022, she scored 435 points with 299 rebounds, 60 steals and 55 rebounds. Lacie was named $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-PCL, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team All-BVC, $1^{\text {st }}$ Team District 8 and $1^{\text {st }}$ Team Northwestern Ohio.

For her career, Lacie scored 1,179 points with 1,011 rebounds, 195 steals and 167 assists.
