They spared neither time nor expense to make the initial Field Meet for Putnam County an affair which was thoroughly enjoyed by the thousand spectators from every section of the county.

Five schools were represented in the meeting and every one of them deported themselves with credit. Every school showed superiority in at least one event, by winning first place and we predict that next year a track team will be developed in every school in the county which will be a credit to the institution they represent.

This year the contestants numbered probably fifty, including both boys and girls. Another year should see the entry list more than double this number. Now is the time to begin to boost for the next year meet. Don't let your enthusiasm lag and leave it all up to Johnson and Kerns to arouse enthusiasm next spring. Practice should continue throughout the whole year so when the time comes contestants will be able to put forth their best efforts.

Don't think that because we have not mentioned the costume drill until this late date, it was not a very pleasing affair. It was what the majority would call scrumptious. It was very pretty indeed. We overheard one party say he did not know Leipsic High School had so many pretty girls.
