The girls' 160 yard relay race was first held in the PCL Track and Field Meet in 1921 with Vaughnsville winning. The winning time and runners are unknown. The times for this particular race were never given and the runners were rarely given. The number of runners varied from 4 - 6. The length of the race wasn't mentioned until 1928 when it was stated that four girls would race 40 yards each for a total of 160 yards.

Relay races were restarted in 1935 and were ran through the early 1940s with various lengths. In 1935 and 1936 the race was 100 yards in length. In 1937 and 1938 it was stretched to 200 yards. In 1939 and 1940 the event went to 220 yards.
